Also known as "Juliettes," are individually registered Girl Scouts who participate in the Girl Scout Leadership Experience but are not in a troop.




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


Using This Guide

Girl Scout programs follow the four pillars of Girl Scouts (Life Skills, Outdoors, STEM, and Entrepreneurship). Each GSDSW program includes a date, location, and Girl Scout level (i.e., Brownie).

Daisies Grades K - 1

A Girl Scout Daisy has screen-free fun, makes new friends, and learns about her world. Fun, friendship, and hands-on learning activities await first and second year Girl Scouts.



Brownies Grades 2 - 3

Brownies learn how the world works, fall in love with the great outdoors, and share their interests with a small group of true friends. They try new things, gain social skills, and have a blast; they're excited to discover all they can do and be.



Juniors Grades 4 - 5

Juniors learn important life skills like what to do in an emergency, hone creative problem-solving skills, exercise leadership qualities, and fine-tune social skills by going on adventures with friends!



Cadettes Grades 6 - 8

Cadettes explore activities focused on discovery, confidence, and practical skills that will help them be their best selves in a year of going, seeing, and doing! They'll think big, consider different perspectives, and make awesome memories with friends.



Seniors Grades 9 - 10

A Girl Scout Senior declares her dreams, spreads her wings, and helps her community. As a Senior, she'll explore careers, pack her bags for amazing adventures, and learn to lead.



Ambassadors Grades 11 - 12

A Girl Scout Ambassador thinks about her life goals, chases her dreams, and creates change. As an Ambassador, she'll explore her personal goals, prepare for college, and even travel the world!



Registration Information

How to Find and Register for Events



Our events can be found on our Event Calendar on our council website page - https://bit.ly/GSDSW_events or www.gsdsw.org - Discover - Activities - Event Calendar.

We use Doubleknot as our registration platform. We encourage you to create a Doubleknot account so you have a record of your registrations. After you have registered for a program or event, you will receive a confirmation email from Doubleknot. Check your spam folder!

Please be sure you have all the correct information needed for each girl or adult before you register, as you cannot make any changes after registration has been completed. This includes dietary information, buddy requests, t-shirt sizes, and other special circumstances or information for the event. Unfortunately, staff cannot change this information once it is submitted.

Fees

Event fees are charged to cover the cost of events and are due at the time of registration. Registration fees can be paid individually, through troop funds, or with Desert Dollars.

Cancellations

If an event is cancelled by council, the person listed on the registration form as the troop or parent contact will be notified by phone or e-mail.

For troop registrations, it will be the responsibility of the troop contact person to notify all girls registered for the event.

Cancellations initiated by the council or program partner will result in a full refund of fees paid in the same manner as it was received (i.e., Desert Dollars).

Registration Deadlines

Please be mindful of event registration deadlines! Early registration is encouraged, as many events fill quickly. Fees may increase past the registration deadline, or spots may not be available. If you are registering for your troop or multiple people, it is imperative to register early!

Event Etiquette

It is important to have directions to the event venue and plan on arriving with enough time to walk to check in before the start time. Please be sure to dress appropriately for the event and the weather. Wear your Girl Scout uniform. Let girls take the lead, while all adults should be nearby to supervise. Allow girls to do the activities with minimal adult intervention. Sometimes event leaders need extra help to manage activities. If you have extra adults or self-sufficient girls, consider asking how they can help. Be sure to thank your event leaders for sharing their time and skills with you.

Monthly Challenges



Monthly Challenges are fun, free activities girls and troops can do to earn a fun patch to wear on their vest or sash. Many troop leaders do the Monthly Challenge as a meeting activity.

Once you do the activity, complete a short online report with a photo of the girl doing the challenge, and the fun patch will be mailed to you 3 - 4 weeks after the end of the challenge.

Women of Distinction

Saturday, April 11, 2026

For more than three decades, Girl Scouts of the Desert Southwest has honored more than 300 women who have distinguished themselves through their leadership, extraordinary contributions to their community, and, most importantly, by exemplifying the Girl Scout mission as women of courage, confidence, and character who make the world a better place.

The proceeds from these events allow Girl Scouts of the Desert Southwest to provide scholarships and deliver the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE). They also enhance our four priority program areas - Financial Literacy, Healthy Living, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), and Outdoor Leadership - and support a variety of activities and programs for Girl Scouts across Southern New Mexico and West Texas.

Highest Awards

Bronze, Silver, and Gold



Bronze Award

The Girl Scout Bronze Award is the highest honor a Junior can earn, and those who achieve it show leadership, teamwork, and dedication.

Spending at least 20 hours on their project, Bronze Award Girl Scouts leave a lasting impact on their community.

More than a service project, the Bronze Award encourages girls to explore an issue, take action, and create positive change - building courage, confidence, and character along the way.

Silver Award

The Girl Scout Silver Award is the highest honor a Cadette can earn, recognizing girls who dedicate at least 40 hours to creating a lasting impact in their community.

Silver Award Girl Scouts identify an issue, explore its root causes, and develop a project that leads to meaningful change.

Through planning, action, and reflection, they showcase their passions and build the leadership skills that guide them into the future.

Gold Award

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest award in Girl Scouts, and those who earn it set themselves apart through their perseverance and grit.

Dedicating more than 80 hours to her project, the Gold Award Girl Scout leaves a legacy to benefit her community and the world.

More than a community service project, the Gold Award is a Take Action project that looks at the root cause of an issue and then puts into place a solution that leaves a legacy with her council and her community.

A note about sustainability of the Highest Award Projects: The guidelines are tools to help examine the underlying root cause of issues, develop sustainable project plans, and measure the impact of Highest Awards projects on their communities, target audiences, and themselves. There is progression from one level to the next - Juniors reflect on how their projects could be continued, Cadettes reflect on and put a plan in place for continuation, and Seniors and Ambassadors work to ensure their Gold Award project is sustained beyond their involvement.


Troop Volunteers

Goal Setting

Girls set cookie sales goals individually and with their team, create a plan to reach them, and develop cooperation and team-building skills along the way.

Decision Making

Girls help decide how the team will spend their cookie money, furthering their crucial thinking and problem-solving skills.

Money Management

Girls learn to budget for their goals, take cookie orders, handle customers' money, gain mathematical and practical life skills, and develop financial literacy.

People Skills


Girls learn to talk to, listen to, and work with all kinds of people while selling cookies. These experiences help them develop healthy relationships and conflict resolution skills they will use throughout their lives.

Business Ethics

Girls are honest and responsible at every step of the cookie program. Business ethics are developed here to reinforce the positive values they are developing as Girl Scouts.

19+ points: You hear the call of camp! Whether you're a returning camper or a natural-born adventurer, Camp Mitre Peak is waiting for you. Don't miss out on the magic—register today!

How Resident Camp Works

Who Can Come to Camp?

Girls entering grades 3–12 in fall 2026 are invited to join the adventure! Register your camper for a session that fits her age, Girl Scout level, and interests. Example: A girl finishing 3rd grade and entering 4th should register for a Junior program, even if she hasn't bridged yet.

Camp Life

Campers swim daily (weather permitting)! On Sunday, girls complete a swim check, learn horse safety, and choose their YOYOs (“Your On Your Own”) which are fun afternoon activities offered in addition to their main program. Some sessions may not include YOYOs every day.

Not a Girl Scout Yet?

No problem! Join for \$25 and then register for camp. All Girl Scouts are automatically covered by camp insurance, so everyone's ready for fun!

Field Trips

Some programs head off-site for extra adventure! Permission to travel is included in registration. Look for the field trip icon in program listings.


Every girl in every session will earn a Girl Scout badge corresponding to that particular program! Some programs will complete more than one badge. Girls will receive their badges at the end of the session.

Camp Registration and Financial Assistance Information



Registration

It is easier than ever! Prices have not increased and the complete registration process is online! Visit <https://bit.ly/GSDSWeventcalendar> for sessions and registration. If you can't register online, call 915-566-9433, ext. 2241, for assistance.

Registration and Payment Deadline

Registrations are accepted until the camp session is full or two weeks prior to the session start date, whichever comes first. A \$75 non-refundable deposit is required to secure your camper's spot. Desert Dollars may be used for a deposit. Payment in full is due 15 days prior to the camp session start date. If full payment is not received 15 days prior to your camper's start date, her slot will be forfeited and opened up to other campers. Your deposit will not be refunded. If you register for camp within 15 days of the session start date, payment in full is required.

Cookie Rewards and Desert Dollars

If your camper sells 3,000+ packages of Girl Scout cookies and chooses a free week of camp, or 5,000+ packages for two free weeks of camp, she must register following the standard camp registration process to reserve her spot. All camp registrations require a \$75 deposit payment at the time of registration to hold the camp session. Once the Girl Scout Cookie Program is complete and all prizes are confirmed, campers who elect a free week of camp will be refunded the deposit paid to hold their camp spot. If your camper plans to pay with their Desert Dollars, she must register following the standard camp registration process to reserve her spot. A completed Desert Dollar redemption form with Desert Dollars must be mailed to GSDSW, 225 E. Idaho, Suite #9, Las Cruces, NM 88005.

Financial Assistance for Camp

GSDSW is committed to making sure that camp is accessible to our Girl Scouts. Families requesting financial assistance for camp still need to register for camp and pay the \$75 deposit. To apply, please go to www.gsdsw.org or <https://bit.ly/CMPFA2026>. Typically, financial assistance covers up to 50% of camp fees.

Refunds and Program Transfer

Requests for refunds must be submitted in writing to info@gsdsw.org at least four weeks in advance of the program date for consideration. The \$75 camp deposit is **NON-REFUNDABLE**. Refunds are not issued for campers who do not attend. Refunds are not issued for cancellations occurring less than four weeks in advance of the session start date. Refunds due to illness or injury require a doctor's note for consideration. If a camper needs to change which week or program she is attending, please contact info@gsdsw.org as soon as possible. There is a \$25 fee for transferring from one session or program to another.

Confirmation

Immediately following your camp registration, you will receive an email confirmation with your receipt from Doubleknot. You will receive another email in approximately two weeks with a Camper Registration Packet that includes health history forms, permission forms, Health Exam form, buddy request, alternate adult pick-up form, and a packing list.

Cancellations

GSDSW reserves the right to cancel a camp program due to insufficient registration, acts of nature, or other reasons beyond our control. In the event a camp program is canceled, a full refund will be issued. For cancellations, an email notification will be sent to each registrant. Phone numbers and emails can be updated at any time in your myGS membership account.

All program offerings have a six-camper minimum. If the minimum is not met two weeks prior to the start of the session, then parents and campers will be contacted to select a different program or receive a full refund.

Register for camp before April 1, 2026, and your camper will receive \$15 Trading Post credit* to be used while she is at camp!

Arrival


Gate will open at 2:00 PM CST.

Parent orientation is at 3:30 PM at the Kiva, if you have questions. After the parent orientation, you can discuss any special custody arrangements or other important information with the Camp Director.

Departure

Campers must be picked up by 10:45 AM CST.

All adults picking up campers must show a photo id. Campers are not allowed to leave camp with anyone other than their parent or guardian without a signed, written statement from the parent authorizing the specific adult by name that is picking up the camper. This authorization should be discussed with your camper and the counselor at check-in and is included in the Camper Registration Packet.



Camper Behavior

Campers who consistently do not follow directions can endanger their own safety as well as the safety of other campers and staff.

A camper may be sent home early for consistently not following directions. A parent phone call will be placed prior to a final decision. No refunds will be given.

Stay 'n Play

Campers may stay overnight at camp between consecutive resident camp programs for free! Campers enjoy downtime, movies, special treats, and getting recharged for the next week. Their laundry will also get done during this time. Check "Stay 'N Play" in the Camper Registration Packet.

Trading Post

The Trading Post has healthy snacks, toiletries, and camp souvenirs available for purchase, from 50¢ to \$20.00. You may deposit money into your camper's account during check-in with cash, check, credit card, or Desert Dollars.



Camp Information

Health Information

Doctor Exam / Camp Physical

All campers are required to have a completed Health Record & Doctor Exam form. This form must be completed after January 1, 2026, and submitted one month prior to the session start date. See the chart on page 18 for deadlines. If registering less than one month prior, then the Exam form should be submitted as soon as possible. This Exam Form must be completed by a physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant with original signatures and dates. Exam forms may be duplicated, but each copy must have original signatures.

Medications

All medications, prescription or non-prescription (including vitamins), must be in the original container with the dosage. Medications must be left with the health supervisor during check-in. Send enough of the prescriptions for her entire camp stay. Include medications that require only occasional use, such as epinephrine pens or inhalers.

Health Screening

Our on-site health screening ensures that campers are admitted to camp without a contagious illness or condition. We screen for 1) raised temperatures, 2) head lice, and 3) foot fungi. Campers remove their shoes, socks, and hair accessories (ponytails, braids, hair beads, etc.) for screening.

Contagious conditions will prevent a camper from being admitted to camp, and if detected, it is the responsibility of the parent to seek treatment. A camper may be allowed back into camp after receiving prescribed care. Camp fees are non-refundable when a camper arrives with a pre-existing condition.

Health Center & Local Services

The Health Center houses the camp nurse and includes an isolation ward and a med/clinic room. Campers' medications are properly stored and administered by the camp nurse. In cases of illness or injury, campers are treated at camp unless further care is needed. When necessary, campers are taken to a local physician or Big Bend Regional Medical Center, ten minutes from the camp in Alpine.



Camp Information

Cell Phone Policy

Camp Mitre Peak follows a no cell phone policy to ensure Girl Scouts safety and inclusion. This means that visible cell phones will be collected by camp staff, powered down, and held until checkout for safekeeping.

This policy applies to other technology or devices if it is deemed a safety issue or a distraction to group activities. If your Girl Scout uses technology as an assistive device, please contact us at info@gsdsw.org to ensure we have the best possible support in place. We welcome adult campers' use of cell phone for photos, but reliable cell service is rare at camp.




Camper Blues

Feeling a little homesick at camp is normal, especially on the first day or two. Most campers adjust quickly and are soon enjoying all the activities, friends, and adventures around them. If a camper continues to feel sad or isn't joining in, counselors and the Camp Leadership Team are there to help and provide extra support.

Parents are always welcome to call and check in with their child's counselor. If the counselor is unavailable, you can leave a message—they'll usually return the call by the next mealtime.

Birthdays

Birthdays are fun celebrations at camp. Special arrangements for giving a present or providing treats for your camper's entire unit can be made in advance with the Camp Director. Campers with birthdays while at camp are recognized during breakfast on "their" day.



Summer Camp Information

Communication

Lack of mail is the chief cause of camper blues. Letters can be mailed prior to your camper's session OR left at our Trading Post during check-in. Please allow at least three to four days for the postal service to deliver mail to camp. If mail is left at our Trading Post, please make sure it is clearly marked with: camper name, program name, and delivery date.

When writing, avoid phrases like we miss you so much, wish you were here, your pet hasn't eaten for a week, or your friends ask about you.
