On my honor, I will try: To serve God* and my country, To help people at all times, And to live by the Girl Scout Law.



Buddy Bench

As children of military members, we understand what it feels like to be new students and need to make new friends. A buddy bench helps new students express their need for a friend to play with during recess. We built the bench from scrap wood donated by a parent. Utilizing knowledge from parent volunteers, we learned how to cut wood, use jigs, drill angled holes, sand, paint wood, and apply a clear coat. The bench was placed on the playground for everyone to enjoy for years to come.

Pet Adoption Bags

These pet adoption bags were created for new pet parents who adopt a cat or dog from the Odessa Humane Society. We wanted to donate to the Odessa Humane Society because they are a nonprofit, no-kill shelter that receives no funding from the city, county, or state, and we felt that the Odessa Humane Society would benefit the most. We created more than 300 adoption bags: 100 for cats, 100 for small/medium dogs, and 100 for large dogs. Each bag included a collar, a toy, a treat, two pee pads, a bandana, and a note with a QR code on it for the new pet parent to get valuable pet information.

<u>Educational Video and Peanut Butter Drive for</u> <u>Meals on Wheels</u>

I had been volunteering at my local Meals on Wheels for about a year and noticed during that time that I didn't see many kids my age there. I also noticed a lot of times the employees there had to ask people to take two and sometimes even three routes because they didn't have enough volunteers. That's when I came up with the idea to make a video explaining how easy and fun the process is. That way, I could show other kids and fellow Girl Scouts and hopefully inspire them to volunteer there too. I also wanted to give back to Meals on Wheels clients, and after talking to them, I realized that peanut butter would be the perfect item to collect. I set up a peanut butter drive and donated 202 jars of peanut butter!

Hope House Serenity Garden

We built a serenity garden for the Hope House, a cancer house serving patients that travel to Midland. We cleaned up the old garden, then added plants, garden soil, mulch, and handmade birdhouses. We are happy to help make the patient's stay a little brighter.

<u>New Pet Parent Bags</u>

pet parents, a collar, a toy, and either a cat treat or doggy bag. We gave the Humane Society representative an electronic version of the flyer to distribute after the assembled bags are gone. We learned to budget our proceeds from the yard sale and adjust our expectations for what we could purchase.



Take a Nail Break

I created a nail class to help with one's mental health as it relates to stress reduction. The class is completely free, and all personal materials are given at the beginning of the session in a box. The box includes a makeup sponge, glass nail file, nail art brush, liquid latex, top and base coat, pair of tweezers, and a QR code to my gold award-only YouTube channel showing how to use each item. Scissors and colored nail polish were also provided, but outside of the box. I created a YouTube channel to help teach how to use each item, along with how to paint an American or French manicure. The class itself is about learning how to paint your nails in a community environment and how that affects mental health by giving yourself time to focus on something new and different while doing it with others.
