

# Girl Scout New Registration

### **Extended Year**

For the 2026 membership year (October 1, 2025 – September 30, 2026), Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA) has set the annual national membership dues at:

\$45 for girl members \$30 for adult members

Extended Year Membership (April 1 – July 31, 2025) New members who join during this window can opt into the Extended Year Membership, which covers both the remainder of the current year and the full following membership year. The standard dues for this option are:

> \$63 for girls \$42 for adults

However, as a one-time offer to help offset rising costs, new members signing up during the Extended Year window will receive a \$10 discount on their membership. This means:

Girls pay \$53 instead of \$63 Adults pay \$32 instead of \$42

This discount is only available to new members and is meant to provide a little financial relief as prices rise across many areas of life.

# 2026 Girl Scout Convention July 20–25, 2026

Join us (and 10,000+ Girl Scouts) at the 2026 Girl Scout Convention in Washington, DC, as we celebrate the spirit, individuality, and self-confidence that make Girl Scouts shine.

This special six-day gathering only happens once every three years and will take place at the Walter E. Washington Convention Center. Convention kicks off with our 58th National Council Session (NCS) from July 20–22, where delegates from around the country and overseas gather to vote on and discuss issues important to our Movement, and elect leaders for the next triennium.

After NCS, from July 23–25, thousands more Girl Scouts (and alums, families, and non-members) stream into town for a multi-day event featuring interactive workshops, inspiring speakers, and once-in-a-lifetime adventures that spark forever friendships.

Girl Scouts Nation's Capital is our host council. We are grateful for their hospitality and support in preparing for and carrying out this important event for our Movement.

#### June Monthly Challenge

#### Riddle Me This - June 2025

Jokes and riddles are both fun ways to make people laugh or think, but they are not the same. Jokes are usually short and funny, using clever words or silly endings to surprise you and make you laugh. They are meant to be funny right away.

Riddles, however, are more like brain puzzles. They ask a tricky question, and you have to think hard to figure out the answer. Solving a riddle can feel like a fun challenge.

While jokes are great fo<mark>r qu</mark>ick laughs, riddles are fun because they make yo<mark>u think. Both can be enjoyable and entertaining in their own way. For J.R. Tolkien fans, <mark>Bilbo</mark> had a challenge of riddles with Gollum over who got to keep the Ring.</mark>

There are different kinds of riddles that make your brain work in different ways. One type is called an enigma. These riddles use tricky or fancy language to describe something, and you have to figure out what it means. For example -1 speak without a mouth and hear without ears. I have no body, but I come alive with the wind. What am I? Answer -an chol

Another kind is a comundrum, which uses jokes or puns to hide the answer in a funny way. For example, my favorite tiddle from when I was a kid is, When is a door not a door? Answer - When it is ajar!

There are also lateral thinking puzzles, which make you think outside the box and use your imagination to solve them. Logic puzzles are more like math or number games, where you have to use reasoning and clues to find the answer. Some riddles are visual riddles, where you look at a picture and try to find something hidden or figure out what's going on.

This month's challenge is to invent a riddle and ask three people to figure it out. You need to keep track of who you asked and if they got it correct or not.
