



Program Monthly Challenge

Popsicle Party June 2023

Summer days can be hot, and one of the best ways to cool off is to eat a popsicle. And what better treat than a popsicle in your favorite flavor?

This month's challenge is to make a batch of popsicles in a new flavor. Maybe it is a new fruit combination like peach and strawberry. Or maybe a new flavor like peppermint or cinnamon. Or how about something crazy like chili peppers or garlic? The options are endless and are limited only by your imagination!

You will need a liquid base such as fruit juice, soda, or club soda, or something creamy like plain yogurt. You can use water; however, the popsicle will be frozen very are - good for licking but not for biting.

Once you choose your popsicle juice, you will need some sort of container to freeze your popsicles in. There are molds you can use, but if you don't have them, you can use a small paper cup with a popsicle stick in the center. Or use an ice cube tray with toothpicks as popsicle sticks. Once you fill the cups or the ice cube trays, cover with some plastic wrap to help hold your sticks or toothpicks upright.

Put your popsicles in the freezer for a few hours to let them freeze solid. It will be hard to wait, but you want to make sure they are good and frozen, so they won't fall off the stick!

Make sure you write down the recipe and then take a photo of you and your popsicle.


Extended Year Membership

Early Bird Season Continues!

The Girl Scout year begins on October 1 and ends on September 30 each year. The Early Bird renewal period is a time for troop leaders and parents to renew their individual and troop memberships for the upcoming Girl Scout membership year.

FREE Daisy by Mail Program

Daisy by Mail Program is a short-term monthly, self-guided program (April – August, 2023) for Pre-K girls preparing to be Kindergartners in the Fall of 2023. This program is FREE to the first 50 incoming Kindergartners with paid Girl Scout extended membership registration (\$35).

Each month this spring and summer (April - August) girls will receive a special, interactive packet in the mail as they are introduced to the Girl Scout program. These packets allow them to earn their first Girl Scout badge and prepare for a troop experience full of friendship and fun in the fall of 2023.

*Note: New, incoming Kindergarten girls may register as a Daisy Girl Scout throughout the months of April – August and will receive their packets based on the start of their registration.

- 4) A minimum of five girls from at least two families

Girl Scout Bridging



Your girls have worked hard completing their bridging steps. They've earned a celebration! Girl Scouts love a good ceremony, so get your troop excited for what lies ahead with the bridging ceremony. Bridging is a beloved Girl Scout tradition that honors girls' achievements throughout the year and celebrates their "crossing the bridge" to the next Girl Scout level. Many troops hold their bridging ceremony in May or June, and some tie it to the end of the girls' current school year.

Like investiture and rededication ceremonies, Girl Scout bridging ceremonies have a few basic elements:

- **Opening:** Welcome your guests and share the Girl Scout Promise and Law.
- **Main section:** Girls, whether physically or symbolically, cross a bridge and are welcomed to the next Girl Scout level.
- **Closing:** Girls participate in a friendship circle and thank their guests.

And the rest is up to the girls! The ceremony should always focus on paying tribute to Girl Scouts as they move forward, but let your girls get creative with how they'd like to celebrate. This is the fun part!


Council Properties

If you rent or use any of GSDSW's buildings, you are responsible for checking all areas to ensure they are clean. Be sure you are wiping tables down to remove crayon/glue/etc., sweeping, or vacuuming, and make sure trash is put in the trash cans and clean recyclables are put in the recycling bins. In many offices, there is no municipal recycling and staff takes it to the city recycling center. Please make sure that there is no trash in the recycling bins.

Painting and messy projects should be done over tile or outside. Do not do these projects on carpet or on chairs with fabric covers. We have many chairs that are stained with paint.

Please check the restrooms to be sure toilets are flushed before you leave. It has been found in multiple buildings that the toilets are not being flushed or are being stuffed with toilet paper. Plumbers and cleaning crews have had to be brought in costing the council money that could have been prevented.

If after your rental or usage it is found that a cleaning crew or plumber needs to be brought in, you will be financially responsible and future usage will be denied.



Council Property Building Rental / Usage

All property / building rentals and usage must follow the process below:

- Submit request to info@gsdsw.org.
- Complete the rental agreement and submit it to info@gsdsw.org.
- Once approved and placed on our property calendar you will receive an email with further instructions.
- No rental / usage of GSDSW properties / buildings are approved without going through the complete process.
- If you are found to be using GSDSW property / buildings without council approval all future rentals / usage will be denied.
